Activity	Hazards	Control measures if needed	Risk level
- General activities and play - Storytelling	 Weather exposure. Creature sting or bite. Soft tissue injury, e.g. sprained ankle. Missing student. 	 Amaroo staff to be aware of weather forecast and adapt activities accordingly. Students to wear closed shoes, hat and encouraged to drink water. Communication device carried at all times. Anaphylaxis pen accessible. Signals and procedures explained at beginning of day. Visiting teachers to supervise play time and do a head-count at the start of each program activity. Amaroo teachers to advise of boundaries and procedures regarding playing in the grounds. 	Low
- Bushwalk	 Weather exposure Creature sting or bite. Soft tissue injury, e.g. sprained ankle. 	 Amaroo staff to observe students in case of heat stress or other physical/ mental stresses and adapt bushwalk accordingly. Bushwalk path known and risks regularly mitigated, i.e. Dead trees removed, path cleared and insect activity managed. Amaroo staff to lead bushwalk and other adult to tail the group. First aid kit carried on bushwalk. 	Medium
- Collage	- Glue	 Non-toxic glue is to be used and Amaroo staff and visiting adults supervise glue use. Collection of materials is confined to small area where little to no hazards occur, for example no stinging plants or nut trees are in this area. 	Low
- Coolamons and sensory activity - Sand drawing	- Allergy - Creature sting or bite. - Injury	 Sensory materials in Coolamons are non-toxic and nut free. Sand area is raked before each day to ensure no hazardous material is present. 	Low
- Dance	- Soft tissue injury, e.g. sprained ankle.	- Dance has simple and safe movements designed for the specific age group. It is also undertaken on flat ground with no known potholes etc.	Low
